2021 Heavy Rains Our Sincere Thanks and a Report on Your Donations

As of November 2021, we received a total of 25,538,640 JPY in donations for the heavy rains that occurred in July and August 2021 (15% was deducted for operating costs). We would like to express our sincere gratitude to everyone who donated. The closing date for donations for this project is the end of December 2021, but the recovery and reconstruction of the affected areas are still only half completed. Civic Force will continue to support the local, community-based recovery and reconstruction efforts through our NPO Partner Projects.

2021: Two emergency deployments and efforts during non-disaster times

For a Disaster-Resilient Society: "Be Prepared" Again for 2022

2021 was another turbulent year for Civic Force. A landslide hit Atami City in Shizuoka Prefecture in July and heavy rain fell in Kyushu in August. The heavy rainfall in Kyushu was declared "abnormal weather" as the amount of precipitation exceeded that of the West Japan floods from three years ago.

"Disasters occur every year." Looking back on the past year, disasters increased in both frequency and severity. In November, the 26th Conference of the Parties (COP26) of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change closed after agreeing on limiting the temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius over pre-industrial levels. Nevertheless, the number of disasters increasing is inevitable.

As an organization specializing in disaster relief, Civic Force is confronting this reality, and we will further strengthen our "Emergency Preparedness Mechanism" in 2022. We will strive to meet the needs of disaster-affected areas through collaborations with companies, NPOs, local governments, and other organizations with varying resources. In addition, Civic force will strive to connect disaster-affected areas together and disseminate information and lessons that only affected people can convey.

Great East Japan Earthquake New Projects Launched

Ten years have passed since the 2011 Great East Japan Earthquake. Civic Force's NPO Partner Projects highlights three themes - "Community Revitalization," "Fukushima Welfare Support," and "Passing Down Memories to Future Generations." In 2021, we launched five new projects and they are underway in cooperation with the eight organizations described below as of December 2021.

Emergency Relief for Atami Landslide Disaster

The Izusan area was heavily damaged from the Atami landslide. Civic Force ran a free transportation service and distributed free taxi vouchers to the affected people in the Hama, Nakamichi, and Kidani districts of Izusan as well as for people staying in evacuation centers. Additionally, we delivered boxed meals, school supplies, cleaning tools, and hygiene goods. We also started NPO Partner Projects in September supporting five partner organizations working on cleaning a temple, caring for affected parents and children, and protecting animals in the affected area.

Emergency Relief for Kyushu Floods



Saga Prefecture flooded again in August

On August 14, heavy rains poured across Kyushu and western Japan, prompting evacuation orders to more than 640,000 households. Due to lessons learned from the torrential rains in Saga Prefecture two years ago, there were few human casualties, but many houses were flooded. Civic Force established a base in Saga Prefecture to distribute relief supplies to evacuation centers and provide transportation in cooperation with local taxi companies. Since September, we have been helping after-school daycare centers resume operations through NPO Partner Projects.

Evacuation Center Assistance under **COVID-19 Pandemic** (Former A-PAD Japan)

Civic Force contributed to raising COVID-19 prevention awareness in evacuation center operations by distributing thermo cameras and handouts in disaster-prone Saga Prefecture. Moreover, we collaborated with Saga Association of Architectural Firms and worked on modeling a layout of the Omachi Town Community Center, which was used for an evacuation center for over 200 people during the Saga Prefecture heavy rain in 2019.

A workshop titled "How the evacuation center has changed under COVID-19" was conducted in Omachi Town, Saga Prefecture. This program consisted of experiential activities including a reception drill practicing temperature checks and sanitization, a tour of the evacuation center, and a setup of makeshift beds and toilets. Residents and local governments employees joined this program, and they took full advantage of this experience during the August heavy rain which occurred two weeks after the program.



Merger with A-PAD Japan

Civic Force merged with A-PAD Japan, a disaster assistance NPO in Saga Prefecture. This will enable us to provide quick and efficient disaster assistance in the Kyushu region, a disaster-prone area.
